Feel free to come early to help set up. Keep it simple, each week can be different and follow kids interests.

- Set up mud kitchen

- Make playdough
- Set up paints
- Make a pot of coffee/tea for parents

### **End of Session**

Please spend a couple of minutes to help pack up the space, toys, dishes etc.

We encourage you to organise activities based on your/your families interests e.g

- Plant a vege or flower patch
- Baking with kids
- Art activities
- Bring in a favourite book or song from home
- Suggest a field trip to beach/park/farm etc

### Committee

Because Playcentre is for families, by families, the support crew comes from inside the Playcentre community. Playcentre creates a sense of belonging as families share responsibilities and decision making.
